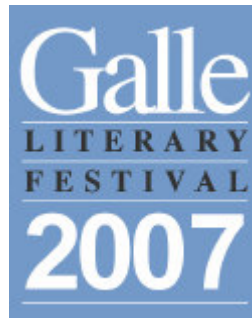
Learn how to make a 40 second script leap to the realms of a full analysis piece. All the whys of writing answered in this workshop.
